



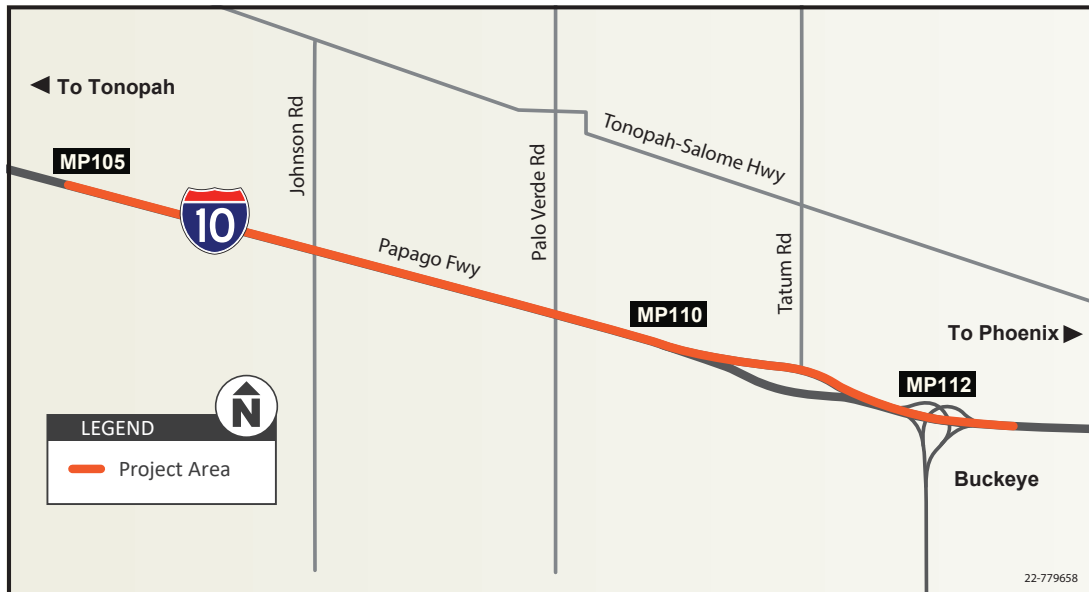
# Interstate 10, Milepost 105 to State Route 85 Junction

## PAVEMENT PRESERVATION

### OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) are repairing the pavement on Interstate 10 between milepost 105 and Junction State Route 85 in Maricopa County, west of Buckeye.

The work consists of milling the existing pavement surface and replacing it with new asphalt concrete. Additional work includes guardrail installation, drainage work, bridge deck rehabilitation work, new pavement markings, traffic control and other related work.



### WHAT TO EXPECT

The project is scheduled to begin late winter 2022 with completion anticipated late fall 2023.

To minimize traffic impacts, night work is scheduled to occur from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m. on weekdays. Drivers are asked to use caution, obey posted speed limits and traffic control devices and use caution around construction personnel and equipment.
